FUNDING RESOURCES

- Grants
 - CSFS Natural Resources Grants and Assistance Database www.nrdb.csfs.colostate.edu
- Online funding sites (e.g. Go Fund Me)
- Local Resources (e.g. Businesses, Rotary, etc.)
- Fund raisers

OTHER FUNDING RESOURCES

- Tie in with local businesses (e.g. New Belgium)
- Local collaborative groups
- Be Creative!

FUNDING TIDBITS

- Truly show the need (Facts and figures)
- Actions support the solution What are the outcomes you want to achieve?
- Ensure you have a truly collaborative effort
 not just on paper
- Reporting is key to remain competitive
- Be flexible your project may have multiple benefits that can compete for other grants

I DIDN'T GET THE FUNDS OR VERY LITTLE, NOW WHAT?

- Unique resources
 - College programs (e.g. Marketing class)
 - Health/Wellness Centers (e.g. Burn Prevention)
- Current programs
 - NFPA's Take Action program http://www.nfpa.org/public-education/campaigns/takeaction
- Local Resources
 - Forming local Fire Prevention Education Teams
 - Local Volunteer Organizations (e.g. Retiree groups/organizations, Boy/Girl Scout troops, 4-H clubs)
 - High school or college students

NOW WHAT?

- HEADLINE: Small organization receives large grant for project
- Small organization coordinator: How am I going to pull this off?
- Answer: Have the capacity to handle the project.
- Question: How do I build capacity?
- Answer: Local resources, partners, organizations, FACO, CoCo, etc.
