FACO is born!


- + 2015: Four interested groups met in August

State-wide networks talk once a month to share and learn from each other


Financial support from the FAC LN will allow FACO to offer several learning exchanges or peer assists annually

Colorado Wildland Fire Conference

- + Held every 18 months
- + Fiscal agent / accounting
- + Set up SOPs
- + FACO offers additional bodies to increase capacity and build depth
- Assist with theme and location selection
- + FACO BOD available to assist with decision making if necessary

A Collective Voice

Reciprocal * Active * Adaptive * Participatory


"Rules" for Learning Exchanges

- + Co-design the objectives
- + Be an active participant and learner.
- + Disconnect from phone and email.
- + Invest in relationship-building with other participants.
- + Share your knowledge and experience and ask critical questions.

Remember, in an exchange, the learning is the joint responsibility of all participants, not just the host!
